GRANTS-IN-AID

Non-Profit groups operating in Wells are reminded that they need to apply each year to the municipality in order to receive grant-in-aid funding from the District. It is now time for non-profit groups to submit their grant-in-aid requests to the District for Council to consider in 2017. *Deadline is December 21, 2016.*

Council carefully considers providing funding assistance to non-profit groups that operate in Wells which provide valuable social and community services in the municipality.

In considering grant-in-aid applications, Council may:

- > allocate funds in response to requests received during the calendar year; and/or
- > reserve funds for unplanned events in order to provide support to groups and organizations during the operating year.

District staff will review each grant-in-aid request and provide a recommendation to Council to consider. All requests for grants-in-aid must be approved by Council.
