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#### **Local State of Emergency**

If required, the Mayor can call a Local State of Emergency that would be in-place for 14 days from time of issue. If an extensions for 14 days at a time are required, they would only occur with the Minister of Emergency Management & Climate Readiness's approval.

Evacuation Alerts and Orders would result in potential an ESS Centre(s) (Emergency Support Services Centre) being setup in Wells and/or Quesnel to ensure each Citizen and their pets and animals have the supports they need.



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#### Appendix A-1—District of Wells Infrastucture





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



# Declaration of State of Local Emergency ORDER

Date: 2024 07 10

Instrument Number: SOLE-001

WHEREAS there is Wildfire within the jurisdiction of the District of Wells;

AND WHEREAS the *Wildfire* poses an existing or imminent threat to people and property within the area known as *the District of Wells*;

AND WHEREAS prompt coordination of action or special regulation of persons or property is required to protect the health, safety or well-being of persons or the safety of property or objects or sites of heritage value;

#### NOW THEREFORE:

I DECLARE, pursuant to Section 95 (1) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act* that a state of local emergency exists in *the District of Wells* due to *Wildfire* and *threatening, people, animals, and properties*.


Per Section 97 (1) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*, the state of local emergency will remain in force for fourteen days, until the end of 2024 07 23 unless cancelled by the *District of Wells* or the Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness or extended by the *District of Wells* with the approval of the Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness.

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### **EVACUATION ALERT**

DISTRICT OF WELLS

Date: 2024 07 10 & Time: 22:00pm

This Evacuation Alert is by the District of Wells due to Wildfire.

Because of the potential threats to health, safety, and the welfare of persons, this **Evacuation Alert** is issued for the following areas:

#### The District of Wells

This evacuation alert is issued to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should an evacuation order be made. Residents will be given as much advance notice as possible before evacuation is ordered; however, you may receive limited notice due to changing conditions.

#### WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Locate all family members and designate a meeting area outside the evacuation alert area, should an evacuation order be made while family members are separated.
- Pack essential items such as government-issued ID, medications, important documents (e.g., insurance, and mortgage / tenancy information), and immediate care needs for dependents.
- Prepare to evacuate disabled persons, children, and/or neighbours if assistance is needed.
- Prepare to take pets with you and move livestock to a safe area (if possible).
- Arrange transportation for all your household members. Fill the gas tanks of personal vehicles that will be used in the evacuation. If transportation assistance will be needed to evacuate, call 250-991-1155.
- Review your home or tenant insurance policy to understand what coverage you may have for




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lodging and food in the event of being evacuated. Most basic insurance policies cover living expenses during an evacuation.

- Arrange accommodation for all members of the residence. If possible, plan to stay with family
  or friends as accommodations may be in short supply.
- If you will require government assistance to meet your basic needs if evacuated, like lodging and food, Emergency Support Services will be available. Create a profile at ess.gov.bc.ca..
- Follow the guidance of *public officers*, *officials*, *or agencies*.
- Wait for an evacuation order to be issued before evacuating. If you evacuate before being directed or authorized, you may not yet qualify for Emergency Support Services should you need it, as resources will be focused on those who have been ordered to evacuate.
- Monitor news, radio, www.wells.ca for information on evacuation orders and the location of reception centre(s). If you can meet your own basic needs if evacuated, you do not need to go to a reception centre.





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## **EVACUATION ORDER**

DISTRICT OF WELLS

Date: 2024 07 10 & Time: 22:00pm

Whereas a state of local emergency was declared on 2024 07 10 by the District of Wells pursuant to Section 95 of the Emergency and Disaster Management Act due to Wildfire within the area of the District of Wells District Municipality of the District of Wells;

And whereas Section 107 (1)(c) and (d) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act* authorizes requiring evacuations in relation to a declared state of local emergency, making arrangements for the adequate care and protection of evacuated persons and animals, and controlling travel to or from an area:

And whereas the *C10705 Cornish Mountain* is a significant threat to the health, safety, and welfare of persons, such that an evacuation and controlling travel is necessary to minimize threats;

This **Evacuation Order** has been issued by *the District of Wells* and is **effective as of 2024 07 10**; **22**:00pm for the following areas:

Eight Mile Lake Area, Nine Mile Mile Lake Area, Cornish Lake, and Mine Sites in those areas. See The District of Wells Ordered Area Map on Page 3

#### YOU MUST LEAVE THE AREA IMMEDIATELY

Members of the *local police department and other applicable agencies* will be expediting this action.

A person must not enter any of the area(s) identified above and in the attached map for purposes of residing, occupying, or visiting the area(s).

The CAO with the District of Wells may, in writing, authorize a person or class of persons to enter and temporarily occupy the area described in this order for the purposes of response to the emergency, preparation or other as specified.

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#### WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Follow the evacuation route provided.
- If you need transportation assistance from the area, advise the person providing this notice or call 250-991-1155.
- If you have homeowners' or tenants' insurance, contact your insurance provider to arrange for living expenses such as accommodation and food.
- Do not turn off your natural gas. FortisBC will turn off natural gas service as needed.
- Close all windows and doors.
- Close gates (latch) but do not lock.
- Gather your family and, if you have room, take a neighbor or someone needing transportation. Do not use more vehicles than you must to help reduce traffic congestion.
- Take critical items (e.g., medicine, wallet, insurance policy number/contact) only if they are immediately available. Take pets in pet kennels or on leash.
- If possible, do not make calls on your phone unless you need emergency service to help reduce network congestion.
- Follow the guidance of *public officers*, *officials*, *or agencies*.

## **EMERGENCY SUPPORT SERVICES**

If you are self-sufficient and don't need assistance to meet your basic needs, you are NOT required to attend an evacuee reception centre.



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
## **DISTRICT OF WELLS ORDER AND ALERT, JULY 10, 2024**
